By attending this APSI, you'll gain deeper insight into the following key takeaways, among several others: Understand the Course; Plan the Course; Teach the Course; Assess Student Progress; and Engage as a Member of the AP Community. In addition, specific attention will be paid to the following AP Classroom resources: unit guides, personal progress checks, AP teacher community, and the AP question bank.

- Align your instruction with the goals, content, and skills of the AP© English Language and Composition course.
- Identify the skills and knowledge that the exam will assess, and identify the tasks and materials for which students will need preparation.
- Engage in the Course Audit process and/or draft a syllabus that meets curricular requirements for the course.
- Make equitable access a guiding principle in designing instruction.

- Begin to plan and pace your own course.

- Develop a toolbox of instructional approaches to the course.
- Engage with and practice assessment protocols.
- Become a member of the AP community (both online and in-person).
